CATHEDRAL CENTER SHELTER for Women and Families Volunteer opportunity: April 26 – 28

Milwaukee's Cathedral Center Shelter, located at Kilbourn and Van Buren Streets, provides emergency shelter and case management services for women and families who are homeless or experiencing a housing crisis. The shelter is open 365 days a year, serving up to 32 single women and eight families per night. Volunteers from churches and other organizations throughout the area provide hospitality and a simple meal for shelter guests each evening.

For many years, volunteers from Immanuel Church have enjoyed being part of this important ministry in our community. Our next opportunity to volunteer is Friday, April 26, Saturday, April 27, and Sunday, April 28. Volunteers spend about two hours (from 6:00 until 8:00 p.m.) greeting guests, providing a light evening meal, making lunches for the following day, and simply offering a friendly presence. Both men and women are encouraged to volunteer, and children may volunteer with a parent or other adult. In addition to making a difference in the community, this volunteer opportunity is a great way to get to know other Immanuel members and friends. Once again this year, Immanuel is participating in a spring flower basket sale to support Eastside Senior Services, a neighborhood program which helps older adults on Milwaukee's East Side continue to live independently and in their own homes. 
... from Community United Methodist Church, Elm Grove



Dear Immanuel members and friends,

Back in 1949, when the world was still recovering from the devastating impact of the Second World War, the Presbyterian Church and other Christian groups gathered together and asked themselves a simple question: "how much money could we raise in an hour to address the suffering in the world"? While the amount raised was small by today's standards, the project was successful enough for them to do so again the following year. Now in it's 70th year, *One Great Hour of Sharing* brings together congregations from 20 different denominations to realize the love of Christ for individuals and communities around the world who suffer from the effects of disaster, violence, and economic deprivation. While the world around us has developed in many ways in the last 70 years, the need for the life-changing work of *One Great Hour of Sharing* is as great as it has ever been.

The season of Lent reminds us who we are, who we serve, and how we are called to live lives of faith. One Great Hour of Sharing presents us with a wonderful opportunity to answer the call to Christian discipleship. Each of the three Presbyterian programs supported by One Great Hour of Sharing - Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, The Presbyterian Hunger Program, and Self-Development of People - work in different ways to serve individuals and communities in need. Examples of projects recently funded include:

- Long-term support for victims of the recent Tropical Cyclone Idai in Malawi, Mozambique, and Zimbabwe
- National Evangelical Synod of Syria and Lebanon rebuilding homes so that displaced families can return and help rebuild cities across Syria
- The Way Home a group that builds housing for homeless veterans in Washington, DC
- New Roots an organization in Louisville, KY that supports urban agriculture through popup farm-fresh food markets at local churches, community centers, and at local businesses located in fresh-food-insecure neighborhoods
- Homes for All Nashville a group that helps tenants work together to obtain fair treatment and
 respect of their rights and advocates for tenants in low-income areas of the city

On behalf of the Immanuel Mission Committee, I invite you to visit the OGHS website (www.presbyterianmission.org/oghs) to learn more about how our gifts help people from all over the world, and I encourage you to offer prayers for the individuals and projects who receive this support. Please join us in supporting *One Great Hour of Sharing* during this Lenten season. You may use the enclosed envelope or the envelopes in the pew racks at church. Donations can also be made online throughout the year at https://pma.pcusa.org/donate/make-a-gift/gift-info/OG999999/. The offering will be dedicated in worship on Sunday, April 28. We're hoping for a Gospel-sized number of fish banks in the collection plates that morning!
